**Message to Mayor & Council:** To whom it may concern,

I am a local business owner, wife and mother of two living at the end of the Pemberton Plateau - with the Parkside development right out our back door.

I was very concerned to receive the Public Notice from Council regarding the Parkside application for a variance to decrease road and sidewalk width by considerable amounts.

With an expected couple hundred people living in the development, plus any extra visitors/tenants/roommates, and all their associated vehicles, the reduction in width creates congestion, and even animosity between neighbours.

I know this as fact because of the drama that our own strata deals with every winter, with one neighbour calling for tow trucks on other neighbour's vehicle, and the ensuing angst this results in.

Most importantly, by reducing sidewalk width you jeopardize the safety of young children, seniors and adults alike.

There will be many people (more than a typical residential complex) using those sidewalks and sides of roads to walk between the complex and the sports fields and centres.

I can predict that the Plateau community will also be walking down the Parkside complex in order to once again be able to access the sports fields, so we aren't just talking about the residents of Parkside complex, but of surrounding complexes as well.

Tightening the space around the lots will lead to some dangerous areas and risk the safety of residents, especially all the children running down to the fields.

We were not given an opportunity to voice our concerns at the council meeting today as promised on the Public Notice, so I do hope you take my concerns of reduced width sidewalks and roads seriously, and vote no to the variance.
